

History of Comus Farm

Originally established in 1921, formerly Hershey Farm, Comus Farm was a working dairy farm for decades within the Martin Family. Crops such as gourds, corn and soybeans were planted and rotated over the sprawling hills.

Herds of dairy cattle were raised, rotated throughout the pastures, and milked in the property's dairy barn. The towering silos stored harvested corn and soy from the nearly 300 acres of land.

The below picture represents Comus Farm circa 1972. Multiple houses, barns, and silos can be seen, many of which are still a part of the farm today.
